<p>Enrichment activities are provided for all students on a weekly basis – the pupil premium funding supports interactive music sessions which are designed to support all areas of the PEAK curriculum:</p> <p>Physical and sensory – responding and moving to the music Emotional and expressive arts – enjoying the sounds, singing and playing instruments Accessing the world - developing interaction and communication skills Knowledge and know how – learning about different types of music and how to make musical sounds</p> <p>Specialist speech and language therapy services are also supported by the funding. Developing communication skills is a key aim within the PEAK curriculum area of Accessing the World. This takes many forms for pupils at Peak and pupils use a variety of methods to help develop and improve essential skills. Speech and language therapy, therefore, provides an essential basis to supporting and improving pupil progress in all other areas of the curriculum. The service also provides training and development for staff in different communication techniques.</p>
